Josh Jennings

Last May, TVOI held its first Furniture Fiesta on Cinco De Mayo. They had several of their reps present to demo products and it was held outside their showroom. This year's fiesta is scheduled for May 4. Josh will send out a Save the Date as it draws closer. If the weather doesn't cooperate it will be held indoors.

TVOI purchased their present building in 2020.

Josh's oldest daughter is in 6th grade and belongs to the junior drama club. They've just presented Newsies Jr. and had 600 people in the audience on opening night next weekend. The experience gives her a chance to develop her leadership skills. The entire production is run by the students.

Josh's younger daughter, a first grader, just received a Student of the Month recognition for being caring.

Josh's wife is a Cohoes Middle School Spanish teacher and is heavily involved in school activities.

Josh is also busy as a basketball ref. He will officiate at 55-60 games this season.

Josh went over some office furniture trends:

Flexibility - many businesses have gone to a hybrid work schedule. Adjustable height desks and moveable furniture can accommodate different office configurations that change from day to day.

In 2018, teachers in classrooms began moving their furniture frequently.

Hoteling stations - desks with no drawers and multiple collaboration areas - to accommodate a workplace where people are moving around and not sitting at a desk all day

Open office - walls are coming down or becoming shorter to promote collaboration

Sustainability - more clients are concerned about using manufacturers that are environmentally responsible, knowing how and where things are made, using recycled materials

Nu2U is TVOI pre owned furniture division. Furniture is resold, not going to a landfill.

Some pieces are remanufactured - cubicles are refurbished, etc. This solution is a step between new and pre-owned.

PreownedOptions.com is located in Holyoke MA. The wood gets refinished, and panels and seating are steam cleaned.

Quick-ship options for seating and storage - can be delivered in about a week.

Biophilia - design that incorporates nature and natural materials, wood.

Other design trends include bright colors, natural light, and glass walls.

The educational vertical is hot right now, with 2.8 billion in sales projected by 2027.

In general the market is expected to expand 5% over the next 8 years.
