TODAY'S SPEAKER

Jordan Modiano Express Employment Professionals

Express Employment Professionals is a global franchise. Jordan opened his first location in Colonie in 2015, and the second location in Saratoga in 2019, just before the pandemic. Express Employment Professionals puts people to work and finds good workers for employers. The most common hire at Express is the evaluation here. An potential hiree can work at a company for 720 hours on a trial basis. If it works out the employee is transferred from Express Employment's payroll to the new company. This comprises 85-90% of their hires.

The hiring company benefits because they don't have to do all the paperwork on the employee pre-hire - Express does all of the documentation.

For higher level positions, there is a direct hire option. In this case Express will recruit for a company and present them with candidates. Their fee is based on a percentage of the employee's annual income.

Express also has contract workers for projects with a specific start and end date or to fill in while an employee is on leave. Jordan said providing these types of employees is a lot of work and the success rate is fair. Since many of the projects are short term (3 days), no shows are very common.

Jordan said that it's often impossible for us to know how much impact our actions have had on people to change their lives.

Jordan tries to personally meet everyone that comes in and let them know that they matter to him. His mission is to change the world, one person at a time.

Jordan and Trent Griffin-Braaf, CEO of Tech Valley Shuttle, are partnering on a plan to work with underprivileged people and provide them with a roadmap to success and teach them life skills. Jordan finished with a story of the day he met his hero. Around 10 years ago he took his then 4 year old daughter, who is on the autism spectrum, to a family fun day. He described how his daughter was eventually able to figure out how to deal with the loud noises at the event, which were very overwhelming for her. Jordan was impressed that she was able to deal with the challenge and get through it on her own, and admires her tenacity.

Jordan drives racecars at the Albany-Saratoga Speedway. Last year they held the first Autism Awareness race. Jordan wanted to stress the importance of early diagnosis for children and also raise funds for the Autism Foundation. The race was a success and will be held again this Sept. 8. His goal is to raise 20,000 for the Autism Foundation. This is the biggest race in the US for its class.
