TODAY'S SPEAKER

Heather McDaniel
Center for Economic Growth

Heather lived in Ithaca for 24 years and has 18 years experience in economic development. Mark Eagan of the Regional Chamber of Commerce asked Heather to come to work for the Center for Economic Growth to replace Katie Newcomb, who was moving on.

The goal of the CEG is to create an environment where every business can thrive. The CEG serves an 8 county region and includes a lot of collaborations and partnerships. They work to prepare regions for growth, help grow existing businesses, and make sure no one gets left behind.

Heather works on workforce development to help supply workers to businesses as the current working age population has declined. They have received a \$40M award to onramp an entry level training center. They are learning the needs of manufacturers and working with young people to hone their experience in trades and soft skills.

The business plan for the center will be done by the end of the year. They will work on manufacturing careers to provide entry level positions and apprenticeships. The focus is on the underemployed and those looking for a mid-career change.

The center will also be working with 7th and 8th graders in 17 schools to form manufacturing clubs that provide exposure to careers in manufacturing.

The state is increasing its involvement in apprenticeship and learn-while-working programs. Currently 57 apprentices are enrolled in the learn and earn program.

Real Life Rosies provides increased opportunities for women through training programs.

Wraparound support and industry-led training result in a decrease in employee turnover. HVCC is a partner in training programs.

Venture Readiness works with industry sectors to build awareness of startups and provides mentors or entrepreneurs-in-residence to work with startups and get them ready to pitch for venture capital. 16 participants have come through this system to date.

The Manufacturing Solutions Group provides opportunities and funding to increase and strengthen operations at existing manufacturers.

Another goal of the center is to attract existing companies to the area to provide more jobs.

They have been actively working to attract companies in semiconductor, biotech, clean tech, AI and quantum sectors. The semiconductor industry will hit \$5 trillion in revenue within the next 5 years. One in 4 of the semiconductor chips manufactured in the US will be made in upstate NY.
